

FAITH FOR THE JOURNEY HANDOUT

Matt 19:17-27 + Mark 10:17-31 + Luke 18:18-30

(P1) And when he was gone forth into the way, there came one, a certain ruler, running, and kneeled to him, and asked him, Good Master, what shall I do, what good thing, that I may inherit and have eternal life?

(P2) And Jesus said unto him, **Why callest thou me good? There is none good, but one, that is, God: but if thou wilt enter into life, keep the commandments.**

(P3) He saith unto him, Which? Jesus said, **Thou knowest the commandments, Thou shalt not commit adultery, Thou shalt do no murder, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Defraud not, Honor thy father and thy mother, and, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself.**

(P4) The young man saith unto him, Master, all these have I observed from my youth up: what lack I yet?

(P5) Then when Jesus heard these things, beholding him, loved him, and said unto him, **Yet lackest thou one thing: If thou wilt be perfect, go thy way, whatsoever thou hast, sell all and give and distribute to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, take up the cross, and follow me.**

(P6) But when the young man heard that saying, he was sad and went away grieved, very sorrowful: for he was very rich, he had great possessions.

(P7) And when Jesus saw that he was very sorrowful, he looked round about and said unto his disciples, **Verily I say unto you, That a rich man shall hardly enter into the kingdom of heaven. How hardly shall they that have riches enter into the kingdom of God! For again I say unto you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of God.** And the disciples were astonished at his words. But Jesus answereth again, and saith unto them, **Children, how hard is it for them that trust in riches to enter into the kingdom of God!**

(P8) When his disciples heard it, they were exceedingly amazed, astonished, astonished out of measure, saying among themselves, Who then can be saved?

(P9) But Jesus looking upon them beheld them, and said unto them, **With men this is impossible; but not with God: with God all things are possible. The things which are impossible with men are possible with God.**

(P10) Then answered Peter and began to say unto him, Behold, lo, we have forsaken all, we have left all, and have followed thee; what shall we have therefore?

(P11) And Jesus answered and said unto them, **Verily I say unto you, There is no man that hath left house, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife,**

or children, or lands, for my sake, the kingdom of God's sake, and the gospel's, who shall not receive manifold more, an hundredfold now in this present time, houses, and brethren, and sisters, and mothers, and children, and lands, with persecutions; and in the world to come eternal life, life everlasting. But many that are first shall be last; and the last first.
